## FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

**I**f you have noticed, we have been restructuring our Maintenance Department over the past couple of weeks.

We hired Lester Cooper as the new Maintenance Supervisor. He comes to us with over thirty years of custodial and maintenance experience having retired from a School System in Iowa. The Park Manager Susan Thimmes will continue to be responsible for the assigning and setting priorities of maintenance tasks to the Maintenance Team. Then Lester will be the one organizing how tasks will be completed and materials needed to complete the task to standards. He will also be training our Maintenance Staff in basic maintenance skills. This will help us develop a Team that can complete common maintenance tasks; therefore reducing our dependence on outside contractors and becoming a large cost saving to Oakwood Manor Association.

We have also eliminated our custodian service. All three of the maintenance men will be assigned custodian duties. This is a work in progress and there will be adjustments made over the next few months but I think it will be a win for our Community. It will reduce our maintenance costs and make the maintenance team more efficient over the next year.



I need to update everyone on the progress of the renovation of the Clubhouse Shower Rooms. The Architect has requested bids from three contractors to be submitted to the Board no later than close of business (COB) on March 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The Board will review the bids and hopefully award the bid to one of the contractors to start around June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017. When we have more details I will pass it on to the membership with a solid start date and projected finish date.

I need to apologize for not having the Pool Ramp installed. We did not know that we needed Sarasota County Health Department approval to install the ramp. Working with our Pool Contractor we got the approval needed to have it installed with one modification needed first. We ordered the part and will install it as soon as we receive it. Sorry about the delay but hopefully it will be in soon.

## TREASURER'S REPORT February 28, 2017

**F**or the month of February, we had operating income of \$84,983 and operating expenses of \$82,556 resulting in an operating profit for the month of \$2,427. For the first two months of the year we have had operating income of \$171,122 and operating expenses of \$158,626 resulting in an operating profit for the first two months of \$12,496.

Our month end cash balances were operating \$173,053 and replacement funds \$192,951.

Additions to fixed assets for the month of February was \$975 for architect fees to Gregory Walls, for shower room renovations.

## MANAGER'S CORNER

**A**s many of you are packing up and leaving, here is your “homework assignments” to be completed before you leave! Hoping all of you will receive an “A+” on your report card! All kidding aside, please take a moment to review the recommendations below!

- Please stop in the Office and fill out “We Are Gone Form”. **Everyone is required to have someone who will be taking care of your property while you are gone. Ask a neighbor, friend, relative, or a home watch company. If your property needs work while you are away, you will be sent a violation letter and will be expected to have the issue taken care of. If you do not, you can possibly be assessed fines.**
- Please make sure the Office has an updated mailing address, phone numbers, emergency contact info, and email address for association correspondence.
- Pick up a “Mail Forwarding Card” from the Post Office or fill one out on-line. The Office no longer is given these forms by the Post Office.
- Cancel any newspapers and update magazine subscriptions.
- Fruit Trees: Consider pulling off all the fruit and “top cut” the trees.
- Please cut low branches a least four (4) feet from the ground to allow mowing.
- All trees except most “fruit trees” need to be permitted by the City of Sarasota before you completely remove them.
- Trim all bushes, shrubs, plants, and trees in your yard.
- Please trim any dead fronds from your Pygmy Date palms, or any other types of palms other than the Queen palms.
- Schedule to have your planters and flower beds weeded while you are gone.
- Please remove ALL potential flying objects from your yard and carport and lock them in your shed or home. (Statues, do-dads, decorative items, wall hangings, flags, grills, porch furniture, pots and planters, etc.).
- Check your tie-downs on your home.
- Consider having your home sprayed for insects/pests prior to leaving.
- Turn off your water prior to departure.
- Turn off your hot water heater before departure.
- Turn off all electric at the meter box, except for your A/C and security lighting. Change your A/C filter and set your thermostat to (80) degrees and dehumidifier to (60) (recommended setting).
- Turn the refrigerator ice cube maker off. If you turn off your refrigerator, leave the doors open so mold doesn’t develop.
- Close blinds, curtains, and shutters.
- Consider putting bleach in all toilets. Seats may be wrapped with “Saran” type wrap.
- Consider disconnecting the red wire on your car battery.
- Lock up and secure your golf cart. Disconnect the battery.
- Make sure your bicycles are locked in the shed or home.

APPROVED MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President Mike Woodruff at 1:00 p.m., at Oakwood Manor Clubhouse, 3330 Fruitville Road, Sarasota Florida 34237.

DETERMINATION OF QUORUM: Present were President Mike Woodruff, Vice President Jim Crowl, Secretary Peg McAllister, Director of Buildings and Grounds Dick Potts, Director of Real Estate Lois Charen, Director of Social Tony Calvino, Director at Large Aggie Taylor, and Director at Large Skip Mann. Absent was Treasurer Frank Dawes. A motion was made by Mike Woodruff and seconded by Peg McAllister to excuse Frank Dawes from the meeting. *Each Director present voted in favor, the motion passed unanimously.* A quorum was established. Also in attendance was Susan Thimmes, Community Association Manager.

CONFIRMATION OF PROPER MEETING NOTICE: Secretary Peg McAllister confirmed the meeting notice was posted in accordance with the By-Laws of the Association at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the date of the meeting.

AMENDMENT OF AGENDA: A motion was made by Mike Woodruff and seconded by Peg McAllister to amend the meeting agenda by removing 6.b- "Acknowledge Pickle Ball Petition/ Set a Special Membership Meeting Date." *Each Director present voted in favor, the motion passed unanimously.* Peg McAllister read a letter addressed to the Board of Directors from Pickle Ball Chair Paul Lancaster, withdrawing the petition submitted to the Board to call for a Special Membership Meeting in which the Membership would vote on changing the common elements by removing the Miniature Golf Course and replacing it with two (2) Pickle Ball Courts at a cost of \$40,000.

**A**t 76, Ray Mickevicius is ending his competitive bicycling as the current Florida Senior State Champion. Starting competitive cycling in the year 2000, Ray has won every race he has entered except at last year's state championship where he had a flat tire. He now holds 16 gold medals in Florida State Championship races.

He has won on 4 different types of bicycles. His favorite bike is his enclosed velomobile. It was developed by his son, Raymond, and is a European -Canadian combined effort.

Police have stopped him numerous times for driving a motorized vehicle without a license and are surprised to discover it is actually a bicycle. Then they usually take a selfie beside him.

Ray and his wife, daughter of Janet Goodrich, have lived in Oakwood Manor since 2009, but have been visiting the area since 1996. They spend five winter months here and one month in Wasaga Beach, Ontario skiing with their grand kids.

## CIRCUIT BREAKERS

**I** recently replaced one of my Federal Pacific Electric Co. circuit breakers at my unit in Oakwood Manor. I learned that Federal Pacific Electric was no longer in business, and that insurance companies were contesting fire claims when Federal Pacific Electric Co. circuit breakers were involved.

Why is the electric panel so vital? The electric panel connects a house to the power company's grid. All the power coming into a house goes into the panel before it is split into smaller circuits and is distributed to various locations in the house. It is the "heart" of the house's electrical system.

I learned from further research on Google that Federal Pacific has been out of business for several years and was involved in several law suits. It seems that FPE panels can work well for several years but when there is a power surge the panel does not reset properly, and a second surge can cause a fire. I discussed FPE panels with Tony Calvino (a retired electrician and Oakwood Manor resident) who is aware of the FPE panel problem and he gave me permission to mention his name. Tony has also written an article for the ACORN on the dangers of the Federal Pacific Electric panels.

I urge all Oakwood Manor residents to check their electric panels and replace them if they are made by Federal Pacific Electric Co. I had mine replaced last week.






